SOME LENTEN TERMS:

Abstinence. Refraining from eating certain foods, e.g. meat, fish, eggs, dairy.

<u>Akathist Hymn.</u> (In Arabic *Medayeh*) A hymn of praise to the Virgin Mary, traditionally sung on the Fridays of Great Lent. *Akathistos* is Greek and means "not seated," since we stand throughout the hymn.

<u>Cheese Fare.</u> The Sunday before Great Lent begins. Traditionally the last day on which eggs and dairy products are eaten until Pascha.

Fasting. Abstaining from all food for a period of time.

<u>Great Canon.</u> A lengthy composition of St. Andrew of Crete, sung on certain nights during Great Lent, accompanied by numerous prostrations.

Great Compline. The Church's night prayer on weekdays throughout Great Lent.

<u>Great Lent.</u> So-called because it is the longest and strictest of our Church's Lenten seasons, The others are the fasts that precede Christmas, the Dormition of Our Lady, and the feast of Sts. Peter & Paul.

Meat-Fare. "Carnival Sunday," the last day on which meat is eaten until Pascha.

<u>Presanctified Liturgy</u>. A service of Vespers during which the Holy Eucharist consecrated on the previous Sunday, is distributed. The Divine Liturgy is not celberated on weekdays during Great Lent, unless a feast occurs.

<u>Relics.</u> Remains of the martyrs and other saints, especially honored and venerated on the second Sunday of Lent.

<u>Shepherd's Care</u>. Our Church's program of alms-giving. The faithful are asked, as they fast during Lent, to remember the poor and set aside money that represents their Lenten efforts, later to be distributed by our Bishop to those in need.

<u>Triumph of Orthodoxy</u>. Celebrates the Church's victory over the iconoclasts with a procession on the first Sunday of Lent.
