Dear Melkite Catholic clergy, faithful, and beloved friends,

During the last four Sundays, we prepared ourselves for the Great Fast by celebrating the Sunday of the Publican and the Pharisee, the Sunday of the Prodigal Son, Meat-Fare Sunday, and Cheese-Fare Sunday. Our hymns, readings, and homilies, reflected on the biblical themes of humility, repentance, mercy, and forgiveness.

As we begin the journey of the Great Fast, we focus on prayer, fasting, and almsgiving to help us "enter by the narrow gate...that leads to life" (Cf. Matthew 7:13-14). If we take this time seriously to fast, pray, repent, and renew our faith in Christ, we will see, experience, live, and proclaim God's love in the Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ.
